PIG RIDE LEGEND

ONE PIG: Non-curving terrain and a ride of short duration (50 miles round trip)

TWO PIGS: A few gentle curve and be a bit longer (100 miles round trip)

THREE PIGS: Long ride (200 miles round trip) with curving terrain and urban area traffic.

FOUR PIGS: Lots of curves, some with "decreasing radius" turns and/or cover a major distance requiring a good deal of technical skill and stamina. Major traffic such as I75 can be part of this rating.

FIVE PIGS: Most difficult category due to the severity and number of curves combined with a long ride. The Southern Highroads Trail, Suches, and Gatlinburg would fall into this category.

Since we have so many new folks in our Chapter, I want to touch on the ABCs of Touring this month. You may have heard us talk about ABC rides and wonder what exactly that might be. The ABCs of Touring is considered a benefit of your National H.O.G. membership. You can earn awesome prizes just for riding your Harley! Crazy right? How many of us need any incentive to jump on our scoots and boogie down the road? Not this girl! However, I have for the past two years participated in the ABCs of Touring and have enjoyed the rides and fellowship with other riders on the journey.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Go to www.hog.com and download the "Entry Form" and "<a href="HOG Magazine Cover"" (if you haven't received the magazine in your renewal packet.)
- 2. RIDE: Get on your bike with the current issue of HOG magazine or the H.O.G. Touring Handbook (cover will do).
- 3. SNAP: take a photo featuring you*, your Harley, and the magazine/handbook cover in front of "official signs." Collect points for each photo with a sign designating:
 - a. Cities and towns starting with the first letters from A Z (1 each letter, 26 points)
 - b. Counties starting with the first letters from A Z (1 each letter, 26 points)
 - c. U.S. States
 - d. Canadian Provinces
 - e. Countries
 - f. National/Provincial Parks
 - g. U.S. National Forests
 - h. Harley-Davidson Facilities
 - i. Harley Davidson Museum
 - j. Harley-Davidson Dealerships **
 - k. International H.O.G. Rally
 - 1. U.S./Canadian Regional H.O.G. Rallies/Pin Stops
- 4. SUBMIT: mail your photos and your entry from by December 31st of the current year to H.O.G.
- 5. WIN: prizes are based on your total points earned (plus a year's worth of bragging rights!)
- * You only need to be in 5 of the photos, the others may be of the bike only with magazine cover and "official sign."
- ** Dealerships may be used for more than one point. For instance, Harley-Davidson of Atlanta can be used as a "Dealership" point, but can also be used as the "L" for your city because it is located in Lithia Springs

and as your state for Georgia. Just be sure to submit multiple copies of the same photo to get credit for each point.

SAFETY CORNER: GUIDE TO GROUP RIDING

It's gonna happen. No matter how much you check the radar and listen to multiple radio stations for the forecast, after all we all should trust out local Meteorologist, you will eventually get caught in the rain on your motorcycle (even you Barbara). Whether you're in the group that have been in the rain before, or the one that will be in the future, you should keep in mind some basic riding tips when it's raining.

The oil, rubber particles, antifreeze and brake dust that cars leave behind becomes a slimy mess of slippery stuff as rain begins to wash it away. It's best if you can take a break, or delay your departure for the first 20 minutes or so after it starts raining. If it is just a light rain or misting, it could be slippery most of the day so be careful. If it hasn't rained in a while, there's even more junk on the road that needs to be washed away.

Once you do start riding, stay in the left or right third of the road to avoid the oil dripping from the truck in front of you. On curves the road usually is sloped to the inside, so the oily water will drain to the low side and pool by the curb. Since oil floats on top of the wet road, you can watch for the rainbow color sheen or drops beading up on the roadway and avoid it.

Once the road has been washed clean, it has about 80 percent of the friction of a nice dry highway, so that means you still need to be about 20 percent more cautious! Start by slowing down and making gradual changes in speed and direction. Avoid the sudden stop if possible by anticipating the actions of the cars in front of you, stop lights, etc... Use more rear brake than normal so both front and rear share the braking equally. Do your braking while still in a straight line, and then ease into turns. Downshift smoothly by engaging the clutch slower than usual.

Painted or plastic road markings, metal manhole covers and railroad tracks are a piece of cake when dry, but become very slick when wet. Watch out for wet leaves in the fall piled up along the curbs too. Adjust your line when crossing slippery areas like railroad tracks to as close to 90 degrees as possible. Brick streets and graded bridges are also more hazardous in the rain.

Hydroplaning is when the water doesn't escape through the grooves of the tire fast enough, so the tire lifts up on top of the water and loses traction. If your tires are worn, they don't have the ability to channel the water away to either side. The harder it rains the more water on the pavement for the tire to channel away. Wider tires have more contact surface during dry weather, but can be more prone to Hydroplaning. Improper inflation is also a factor and can increase the chance of Hydroplaning. If you do feel the bike start to wander, slowly ease off the throttle and keep the front wheel

PROPOSED HOUSE BILL 166 - MOTORCYCLE MOBILITY SAFETY ACT

HOUSE BILL 166 has been introduced by Representative John Yates of the 73rd, Alan Powell of the 32nd, and Earnest Smith of the 125th to amend Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the uniform rules of the road. The proposed changes provide for the safe operation of a lightweight motorcycle or motor vehicle through an inoperative traffic-control signal; to repeal certain provisions relating to handlebars; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. This Act will be known as the Motorcycle Mobility Safety Act.

The Bill Reads:

Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the uniform rules of the road, is amended by revising subsections (a) and (e) of Code Section 40-6-20, relating to obedience to traffic-control devices, as follows:

- "(a) The driver of any vehicle shall obey the instructions of an official traffic-control device applicable thereto, placed in accordance with this chapter, unless otherwise directed by a police officer, subject to the exceptions granted the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle in this chapter. A violation of this subsection shall be a misdemeanor, except as otherwise provided by paragraph (2) of subsection (e) and subsection (f) of this Code section."
- "(e)(1) Except as provided for in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the

The disregard or disobedience of the instructions of any official traffic-control device or signal placed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter by the driver of a vehicle shall be deemed prima-facie

evidence of a violation of law, without requiring proof of who and by what authority such sign or device has been erected.

(2) If a traffic-control device or signal is inoperative due to the lightweight design of a motorcycle or other motor vehicle and the driver has remained stopped for not less than 60 seconds, then the driver may treat such traffic-control device or signal as a stop sign, and his or her right to proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable after making a stop at a stop sign as provided for in Code Section 40-6-72. Nothing in this paragraph shall restrict the permissibility of a driver to make a right turn as provided for in paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of Code Section 40-6-21."


Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 40-6-314, relating to footrests and handlebars, as follows:

- "40-6-314. (a) Any motorcycle carrying a passenger, other than in a sidecar or enclosed cab, shall be equipped with footrests for such passenger.
- (b) No person shall operate any motorcycle with handlebars more than 15 inches in height above that portion of the seat occupied by the operator or with a backrest more commonly known as a sissy bar that is designed in such a way as to create a sharp point at its apex."

(They are requesting the removal of the handlebar restriction from the code.)






